



IPM COURSE ON THE USE OF DIGITAL RESOURCES IN MOE ONLINE RESOURCES PORTAL

Educators use a lot of third party copyright material, and often create their own copyright works or collaborate with other parties (vendors, partners, students, etc.) to create works.

IPOS International (a wholly owned subsidiary of the Intellectual Property of Singapore) worked very closely with educators and MOE to specially curate and develop this programme for educators and MOE officers.

The objective of this course is to equip MOE officers with the skills and knowledge required to navigate the intellectual property (IP) issues involved in the creation, usage, and sharing of digital resources in the MOE online resources portal.

Sample case study scenario

Angie is a Curriculum Resource Development Officer in CPDD developing resources for the broader History curriculum in MOE secondary schools. Over a family dinner one evening, Angie's brother gave her the idea of using images and videos available online to create a set of more interactive instructional materials for teachers and students.

Angie then created several revisions of instructional material, featuring various tables, activity sheets and Powerpoint presentations. These were enhanced by Angie using materials found online and from textbook sources.

Angie shared the resources on the OPAL MOE online resource portal, and is considering uploading some existing secondary school students' work to illustrate how the teaching resources can be used.

Ben came across Angie's postings on the portal, and decided to modify some of her materials for his own students.

- 1. Angie was told by a colleague that her brother is also the copyright owner since he came up with the idea for the instructional material. Who is the owner of the copyright in the instructional material? Why?
- 2. The students created the works in their schools as part of an existing curriculum, using the school resources. In that case, can Angie proceed to upload their works onto the MOE online resource portal? Why?
- 3. Ben noted that Angie incorporated various diagrams in the instructional materials that she uploaded, and would like to use those diagrams as part of his lesson plan. What are the legal exceptions that may be applicable in this context to allow Ben to use the diagrams?
- 4. Ben noted that some of the videos embedded in Angie's Powerpoint presentations are stated to be licensed under the Creative Commons licensing terms "CC BY-SA". What does "CC BY-SA" mean, and what should Ben take note of when using or sharing such videos?
